Gardaí quit as fears grow of extra tax on retirement

GARDA numbers are falling following fears that retirement lump sums are to be taxed on top of the pension and income levies.

Hundreds of senior gardaí have taken early retirement this year, and a recruitment freeze is exacer-

hating staff shortages.
National specialist units and others in Dublin which tend to target organised crime have been particularly badly hit as senior investigators leave. And the brain drain comes as gangland activity escalates.

Two weeks ago, Detective Superintendent Eugene Gallagher, who was second in command of the Bureau of Fraud Investigation, retired eight years early. The former head, Chief Superintendent Pat Brehony, left several months ago.

Meanwhile, Detective Superintendent John McDermott, second in command at the Criminal Assets Bureau, is to retire soon despite having four years left.

Three senior detectives in Dublin involved in major gangland investigations over the years have also quit early, in addition to numerous
